



Charging at work – 7 things you need to know about getting an EV charge point in your office

1) You can receive a Workplace Charging Grant from the Government

The government offers initiatives for workplace charging to make it more accessible for businesses to go green. Make use of the Government's 'Workplace Charging Grant' scheme, which allows businesses to claim up to £14,000 towards the cost of installing EV Charging. The scheme was introduced by the Government's Office for Low Emission Vehicles to help support and encourage organisations looking to install electric vehicle charging facilities at their workplace – so make the most of it!

You could also be eligible to take advantage of <u>tax super-deductions</u> on new plant and machinery as announced in this year's budget, which are applicable to EV charge points. This new policy will allow companies to cut their tax bill by up to 25p for every £1 invested.

2) And you can even turn it into a revenue stream for your business

When you install EV charging points at your workplace, you can make the decision to make them available for public use as well as for your employees. In doing so, you can establish a separate public tariff, whereby you can charge the public who use your charge points — in order to generate revenue. You can even set dedicated tariffs for different groups of drivers, allowing you to personalise pricing for the likes of staff, visitors and the public. This could provide you with the opportunity to generate revenue through the EV charge points installed at your sites.

3) There are clear benefits for employees too

Following the installation of electric charging points at your workplace, the next step is to encourage employees to make the most of them – and there are some huge benefits to inform them of. Employees can take advantage of several new government initiatives, enabling employees to make the switch to an electric vehicle with 0% BIK tax (rising to 1% as of1st of April 2021).

In addition to this, the recharging cost of an EV is likely to be much cheaper than refuelling a petrol or diesel vehicle. Having dedicated workplace charging points will help support your employees in keeping their EV charged up. Informing your employees of these benefits could encourage them to switch to an EV vehicle and enable your business to become collectively more sustainable.

4) It will considerably reduce your businesses carbon footprint

In order to achieve the UK's ambitious goals to be net zero carbon by 2050, it's vital that everyone plays their part – including business of all shapes and sizes.
